

WHAT'S NEW: Guidance on PHAS Appeal Process

As part of the Public Housing Assessment System (PHAS) process, a Public Housing Agency (PHA) is given the opportunity to appeal its PHAS score, indicator score, or designation status. If a PHA believes an error has occurred it can submit an appeal in accordance with <u>PHAS Final Rule</u> 24 CFR § 902.69.

APPEALS

A PHA may appeal its PHAS score, indicator score, or designation if it believes an objectively verifiable error has occurred in accordance with *PHAS Final Rule 24 CFR § 902.69*.

Examples of appeal requests include:

- Error has occurred in scoring due to the PHA submitting incorrect PHAS or indicator data.
- Error has occurred in scoring due to a PHAS score being miscalculated by REAC.
- Error in assessment of late penalty points that were due to circumstances beyond the HA's control such as, documented and verifiable computer/system failures.

The following specifications must be met to submit an appeal request:

- The PHA **must** submit a request in writing to the Director of the Public and Indian Housing Real Estate Assessment Center (PIH-REAC) <u>no later than 30 days</u> following the issuance of the PHAS score to the PHA.
- The appeal **must** result in a change of the designation status for the PHA.
- The appeal request **must** include supporting documentation.
- The PHA **must** send a copy of the appeal request to the Field Office.
- The appeal can be for one or more indicators of the overall PHAS score, or its designation.
- An appeal **CANNOT** be submitted for a Late Presumptive Failure (LPF) score of zero (0), as it **does not** constitute an objectively verifiable error.
